Pupils should be taught to: Understand geographical similarities and differences through studying the human and physical geography of a small area of the United Kingdom, and of a small area in a contrasting non-European country.	VIP (VERY IMPORTANT PERSON)	Mix materials to create texture e.g. torn. Going Deeper (Level 3): Select and arrange materials for a striking effect. Ensure work is precise. Use coiling, overlapping, tessellation, mosaic and montage.	
Use basic geographical vocabulary to refer to: key physical features, including: beach, cliff, coast, forest, hill, mountain, sea, ocean, river, soil, valley, vegetation, season and weather.	HOW TO CLEAN THE OCEAN	To investigate places: Level 2 Ask and answer geographical questions (such as: What is this place like? What or who will I see in this place? What do people do in this place?). Use world maps, atlases and globes to identify continents and oceans. Going Deeper (Level 3): Ask and answer geographical questions about the physical and human characteristics of a location. Use maps, atlases, globes and digital/computer mapping to locate countries and describe features. To communicate geographically: Level 2 Use basic geographic vocabulary to refer to key physical features including: beach, coast, ocean and river. Going Deeper (Level 3): Describe key aspects of physical and human geography including: rivers, mountains, volcanoes, earthquakes, water cycle, settlements and land use.
